Our services

We provide a whole range of local services including:



roads and pavements

planning and planning applications



care and support for children and adults



housing and council tax benefits

parks, country parks and green spaces

Why is this happening?

As one council we can:

- protect essential frontline services like bins, housing, roads, schools and social care
- make it easier for you to know who to contact for all your council services
- reduce duplication and give you better value for money
- have a stronger voice at a national level to lobby for Buckinghamshire's interests - for example increased school funding

Our spending plans for 2020/21

- improving roads and pavements
- protecting vulnerable children, adults and older people
- tackling homelessness and rough sleeping
- combatting climate change
- and putting £4 million into local priority schemes through the new Community Boards

In addition, over the next three years, we'll invest nearly half a billion pounds to:

- provide new schools and more housing that is affordable
- improve roads, pavements and other infrastructure
- improve and regenerate our town centres
- pump £111 million into boosting the local economy

Building more affordable homes now and for future generations, providing extra help and support for an increasingly older population and improving the health of people who live in the more deprived areas of Buckinghamshire.
